



*OPEN QUESTIONS: An open question is a question that cannot be answered with a "yes" or "no" response, or with a static response (open questions give extra information).

Some examples:

- *a)* How are you today?
- b) Why did you love your friends?
- c) What's your intention?
- d) What do you think about what's happening in chile with coronavirus?

*CLOSED QUESTIONS: a closed question is a "yes/no" question or one in which I have limited options to answer.

Some examples:

- a) What's the Capital of France?
- b) Are you happy?
- c) What day is it today?
- d) Is she your sister?
